In 2000, she completed a specialisation study at the Industrial Property Training Institute at the Industrial Property Office and subsequently became a patent attorney and a European patent attorney.

Prior to joining our law firm in 2023, Ivana had worked for a specialised law and patent firm since 1997, first as a patent expert, then as a patent attorney, and in recent years she has been mainly involved in the agenda and coordination of validation of European patents in the Czech Republic and Slovakia.
